

## Cause : reason

We use "AS" and "BECAUSE" to express cause and reason, exp:
 "As he was ill, he didn't go outside."
 "He didn't play with his friends because he was ill."

## Effect : result

We use "SO" and "THEREFORE" to express result and consequence, exp:
 "He was ill. So, he didn't go outside."
 "He was ill. Therefore, he didn't play with his friends."



## **IRREGULAR ADJECTIVES:**

Some short comparative adjectives have irregular forms:

Good => better Bad = worse Far => farther / further

Many / much => more little = less
